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### DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Welcome to *Voices of the Eighth: Chronicles II*, the continuation of the storytelling series of Harrisburg's historic Old Eighth Ward where the lens focuses on African American residents and their allies who forged change through resistance and perseverance. This story unfolds through the storytelling, singing, and movement of beautiful and powerful griots and the Sankofa bird which connect us to our past, present, and future through the play's vignettes that highlight just a few of the One Hundred Voices found on the orator's base of the Gathering at the Crossroads monument on the Capitol grounds.

In writing this play, I knew it would be impossible to share in entirety the lives, times, and contributions of Sarah and Joseph Bustill, Dr. Agnes Kemp, William Howard Day, Alice Dunbar Nelson, and Maude B. Coleman. My vision in crafting this production was to use percussive sounds, African inspired movements along with the actual words and writings of these historic change-makers and the gifted poet, Marian Thornell, to present an engaging and accurate historical glimpse of people who had been oppressed and marginalized but still achieved triumphs and progress as they fought to dismantle so many -isms in social constructs, politics, and education. I also want this theatre experience to spark a broader conversation that pushes each of us individually to make choices that move us toward freedom, liberty, and justice for all. It is very hard work, but we must do this. The partnership between Sankofa and Gamut to bring these stories to students and our community is a template- we make space, we teach, we learn, we mess up, we do good, we listen, we admit it's hard and painful, we hear, we learn some more, we move forward better.

I am so proud of all the creatives that came together to bring my script to life in such a powerfully moving way. I am indebted to the work of the PA Past Players and the One Hundred Voices researchers and history detectives who uncovered the buried stories of the people of the Old Eighth Ward.

### DRAMATURG'S NOTE: SANKOFA IN ACTION BY KIM GREENAWALT

You may be wondering about the title of this show: why "Chronicles II?" Indeed, when was the first Chronicles? For anyone who may have watched *Do You Know Me*? online in 2021, some of the stories you'll see and narration you'll hear this evening may be familiar. I would like to believe that this was the first Chronicles...although we didn't know that yet. Like the concept of Sankofa, (we'll get to it in the show!) Sharia has gone back to a former storytelling format of vignettes, which worked incredibly well in the past, and brought it forward into the present, for a different group of actors.

As the dramaturg and stage manager for *Do You Know Me*? and *Voices* of the Eighth: Chronicles II, it has been a treat to see how the change of format from digital to in-person, and the change of actors involved has shaped the work. By going into the past in our theatre-making, we can take what has worked in the past and bring it forward to support a vibrant present with a new set of actors. By going into the past, into Harrisburg's history, we take the stories of freedom seekers and change makers to guide the path of a new twenty-first century community.
